COMMERCIAL PILOT LICENCE QUESTIONNAIRE

Note: This questionnaire is a continuation of the PPL Questionnaire Please attach as required the information relating to the TEST FORM GROUND ITEMS at the end of this questionnaire.

- 1. List the minimum serviceable instruments required for a VFR day charter?
- 2. Whilst pre-flighting your Cessna 210 for a DAY VFR charter, you notice a non-mandatory instrument is unserviceable. What are the requirements with regard to this instrument and is the flight able to proceed with it unserviceable?
- 3. What are the minimum radio communication systems required to be serviceable for a VFR day charter in CTA and OCTA?
- 4. The AIP GEN 1.5 refers to a requirement that for charter flights your radio communication systems are to be able to maintain communication with ATS at all stages in flight what does this mean?
- 5. Under what conditions can a charter aircraft be exempt from the requirements to carry HF radio?
- 6. List the items which must be checked before refuelling should occur by any means drums or otherwise?
- 7. There are a number of minimum distance requirements with reference to fuelling points and other aircraft etc. List these.
- 8. What are the requirements with regard to passenger movements (ambulatory and non-ambulatory) when refuelling an aircraft?
- 9. How many fire extinguishers shall be placed within 15m, but not less than 6 m from the aircraft and fuelling equipment?
- 10. There are a number of minimum distance requirements with reference to starting an aircraft and it's proximity to sealed buildings etc. List these.
- 11. All passengers must be orally briefed before each take off. What points should be covered and what regulations cover this requirement?
- 12. You are asked to conduct a scenic joy flight in a Cessna 182 from YRED to YTGA. Your Chief Pilot asks you to conduct the flight as a direct track <u>at</u> 2,000ft AMSL. What are the requirements with regards to carrying / wearing life jackets and life rafts for this flight?
- 13. When preparing for the above flight, you are advised that no life jackets are available. Is there any way this flight could be conducted if the CP was flexible about the altitude & tracking requirements?
- 14. Are emergency locator beacons mandatory on all flights? Explain.

- 15. Is the track CS Mt Isa CS in a designated remote area?
- 16. You conduct a charter on the above route in a Cessna 182. What equipment must the flight carry.
- 17. Is it acceptable to use a standard passenger weight in a seven seat aircraft for the calculation of weight and balance? If so, what is the standard weight?
- 18. What ages apply to the title
 - a. INFANTS and
 - b. CHILDREN?
- 19. You are to conduct a charter in a four seat aircraft (C182). There are five potential passengers Yourself (80Kg), two adults (70 Kg each) and two children (30 Kg each). The aircraft weight & performance limitations are not exceeded. May the flight proceed, if so how?
- 20. What are the restraint requirements when infants are carried on the lap of a passenger?
- 21. What maintenance can be carried out by the pilot of an aircraft?
- 22. Explain what a mercy flight is, what are the requirements for declaring a mercy flight
- 23. What type of aerodrome may be nominated as an alternate aerodrome?
- 24. What WX conditions when forecast will require an alternate aerodrome to be nominated
- 25. How long before the currency of a TAF, with below alternate minima forecast, will the operational requirement apply to you?
- 26. When an alternate aerodrome requirement is being lifted because of a FM period, when is the alternate aerodrome no longer required?
- 27. What is the associated holding fuel allowance when a forecast is endorsed INTER and TEMPO and WX is below the alternate minima?
- 28. What are the minimum qualifications of a CPL candidate?
- 29. What are the privileges of the commercial licence?
- 30. How often must a commercial pilot do a flight review with an approved person?
- 31. Can a Commercial Pilot hold a class 2 medical?
- 32. To carry passengers on a VFR day charter, what are the recency requirements for the pilot?



- 39. Above what altitude must a flight crew member continuously use supplemental oxygen in an un-pressurised aircraft.
- 40. When a flight crew member is not on flight deck duty what are the supplemental oxygen requirements
- 41. What factors shall a pilot consider when deciding which aerodrome to land at, in the event that in a multi-engine aircraft one engine has failed?
- 42. Define: Declared conditions, declared weights, corrected effective operational length
- 43. Determine the DDA for YRED in January and June
- 44. What is the minimum climb gradient an aeroplane (MTOW <5700 Kg) with gear extended at VTOSS must have the ability to achieve without ground effect and with all engines operating.
- 45. In the event of a go-around what is the minimum climb gradient an aeroplane (MTOW <5700 Kg) with take-off power at speed not above 1.3VS must have the capability to achieve?
